

**Carpenter Brunzel constructs an apartment building.  
Constructing and living in  
Prenzlauer Berg in the 19<sup>th</sup> century**

In Pankow, a district which is located in the heart of Berlin, the museum association created a permanent exhibition established in an old apartment building. This "Mietshaus" is located at Dunkerstr 77 near by the Helmholzplatz and authentically shows the history of its former inhabitants.

The exhibition is focused on various aspects linked to the immigration to Berlin, the development of the region around Helmholzplatz which is in the north east of Berlin. The museum and its collection demonstrate living and working conditions around the 1900's.

It is a unique exhibition initiated by several associations such as "Seniorenfreizeitstaette Herbstlaube", an organisation sponsored by the commune, the "Seniorenvertretung" Pankow, an association of retired people, and with the support of "Quartiersmanagement Helmholzplatz", a public association. Retired people are pleased to serve as guiders to visitors during opening hours.

The building is currently used by the municipal body "Bezirksamt Pankow", division Culture and Education. The house was built from 1884 to 1886 as a school.

The water tower has been transferred into both a library and museum. Nowadays, the museum association has chosen this place as its head quarter.

After major reconstruction of the main exhibit hall from 2003 to 2004, the museum association displays specific selected exhibits which are dedicated to history of this district in Berlin.

Often, the association works together with its partners. However, the exhibit hall can be also used by non- partners.

This permanent exhibit about the life of the  
beorgage around 1900 is displayed in the  
former flat of manufacturer Fritz Heyn  
which is located on the first floor  
("Beletage").

Rudolf Doerrer founded this museum in  
1965 in the frame of "Stadtbezirks-  
Chronic" and it was a place of Panke  
Museum until 2001. In this building you  
can find original as well as reconstructed  
paintings in the stair-case area.

At the "Beletage" you can see two rooms  
with original stucco and its colours from  
the end of 19<sup>th</sup> century.

In the special exhibit you can learn about  
the life of chair manufacturer Fritz Heyn,  
his family and former inhabitants.

Today, the entire building is marked as a  
historical building by the state  
(Denkmalschutz). The house, gardens  
and arbour can be visited during opening  
hours.
